\$90,000

The project aims to address historical trauma by providing workshops, establishing monthly talking circles in the Red Lake communities, and adding new participants annually. It will also foster partnerships with organizations and collaborate with local Tribal programs to deliver services that support community members in addressing these issues.

All Nations Rise \$120,000

Address historical trauma in White Earth communities by equipping parents and children with civic and cultural knowledge and skills needed to develop healthy relationships and support leaders in creating positive change.

Ashby Legacy Fund \$40,000

Enhance recreational opportunities and create vibrant and inviting public space for families and children to enjoy by refurbishing soccer fields and installing new ADA-compliant playground equipment in the park. Foster community engagement and collaboration in the installation process by engaging volunteers and hosting a celebration upon completion.

Bear Paws Cultural Art \$100,000

Preserve, revitalize, and share Ojibwe cultural heritage, foster mutual understanding and respect with our neighbors, and facilitate community healing through art. Provide traditional and contemporary Indigenous Art classes taught by local Master Indigenous artists that are free and open to the public.

Increase family time with benches, outdoor seating and other aspects to intrigue families to get out and play. Provide more opportunities during the school day and during the summer months for summer camp.

Implement the Pathway to Fitness program to improve amenities and create opportunities for safe physical activity to encourage intergenerational engagement and learning.

Gunflint Trail Historical Society/Chik-Wauk Museum and Nature Center

Bring the stories of Anishinaabe people more fully into Chik-Wauk Museum by constructing a new exhibit with intergenerational engagement that celebrates past and present Anishinaabe traditions and contributions of Gunflint Trail Community members and Border Lakes region residents. Horizon Public Health The project promotes mental wellness and belonging for Grant County students through school-based interventions, including mapping sessions to identify needs and presenting findings to city councils and school boards. It collaborates with educators on civic education, works with city governments on community projects, and celebrates successes with student-led presentations at community events.	\$50,000

Efforts include engaging residents to shape the Land Sanctuary's use, strengthening partnerships with regional organizations, and furnishing a yurt as the first dedicated community gathering space.

Manoomin Arts Initiative

\$90,000

Build the capacity of Manoomin Arts Initiative to activate accessible community creative spaces through the purchase and redevelopment a building that will meet the needs of local artist-entrepreneurs and culture-bearers.

Minnesota Children's Press

\$20,000

Promote early literacy for K-4 children in Grand Marais while fostering intergenerational learning about Native American mail carrier John Beargrease's contributions to North Shore history. In a screen-free and social media-free environment, children and mentors will create a book, a bronze sculpture, and a website to share Beargrease's story, while also training youth in communication skills for community events.

Minnesota Seeds of Justice

\$50,000

Use the Youth Participatory Action Research (YPAR) approach to engage local youth in shaping the design and functions of a cultural community resource center for Worthington's diverse population. Arts and culture will be integrated into the process, with creative collaborations to share findings and celebrate the comprehensive plan with the community and stakeholders.

Mni Sota Arts \$80,000

Renovate the Mni Sota Arts building to support Native and BIPOC artists by creating a welcoming community space. Improvements include a new facade, ADA-compliant bathrooms, energy-efficient HVAC, updated lighting and electrical systems, and kitchen upgrades to enhance gatherings and foster a sense of safety and nourishment.

Replace percussion equipment for the N-K School District Band program

North Central Minnesota Farm & Antique Association

\$30,000

Insulate, heat and finish a portion of the NCMFS&IA building to expand the number of events the organization can host year as well as opening the facility for use by other community groups and individuals.

North House Folk School

\$75,000



Increase the capacity of North House Folk School to meet the growing needs of local residents, students, and event participants through the building of a new Welcome Center.

Northern Itasca Joint Powers Board

\$20,000

Update the current comprehensive plan to guide future growth and development for the Edge of the Wilderness area communities.

Oldenburg Arts and Cultural Community

\$50,000

Promote creative placemaking in Carlton and the Fond du Lac Reservation by exploring the repurposing of the Old Jail as a Community Center for Creatives and launching the Carlton Area Arts and Culture Commission. The goal is to foster cross-sector collaboration, support local artists and culture bearers, and integrate arts and culture into community development efforts for inclusive and sustainable prosperity.

One Heartland \$70,000

Design and implement programs tailored to the social and recreational needs of rural children to reduce isolation and foster a sense of community. Ensure all camp activities are accessible and inclusive to address the needs of campers of varying ability levels and backgrounds.

Pelican Rapids United Soccer Association

\$25,000

Promote community cohesion in Pelican Rapids' diverse community through renovations to Thompson Park, including replacing the soccer goals and playground expansion.

Prairie Island Indian Community

\$85,000

Educate Minnesotans on Bdewakantunwan perspectives of living with the Wakpa (river) and addresses flooding through documentation, historic preservation, and public engagement. Create a map and artwork panel for a public park, producing a guidebook, hosting town meetings, and launching a website to share these insights and foster community understanding.

Pride Support Network

\$90,000

Address social isolation among LGBTQ2S+ individuals by creating safe, affirming spaces for connection, community building, and support, with a focus on Indigenous/Two-Spirit identities. Serve as a trusted hub for resources and outreach, fostering a welcoming environment that encourages rural residents, particularly youth, to stay and thrive.

Regional Native Public Defense Corporation

\$70,000

Revitalize downtown Cass Lake and boost community pride by transforming the RNPDC office building from a symbol of neglect into a vibrant, welcoming community center. This includes exterior wall reconstruction, comprehensive



renovations, and improved signage to enhance public awareness of RNPDC's mission and resources.

Something Cool, Inc. \$90,000

Foster community engagement across all ages by leveraging local creativity and skills to create art installations reflecting the community's heritage and pride. Visible landscape changes and a strategic plan ensure long-term impact, with a celebratory focus on participants' contributions as a gift to the community.

Spang Township \$41,000

Renovate the town hall to serve as a hub for communication and services during severe weather events or other emergencies.

Warroad Community Development \$25,000

Draft a comprehensive strategic plan for Warroad, focusing on a shared vision for a vibrant and inclusive future through community and stakeholder engagement. A steering group will be created, and a consultant hired to support environmental scans, a SWOT analysis, and engagement efforts, incorporating input from diverse community members and culminating in the plan's adoption by key local organizations.

Winnebago EDA \$120,000

Improve community sustainability and revitalize neighborhoods by piloting a program to renovate existing affordable housing stock. Develop a plan to sustain the program for a minimum of five years.
